# Choose Drachman's Montessori Middle School Experience!

As you likely know, adolescence (particularly early adolescence) is a time of tremendous change for middle school students: physical, intellectual, emotional. Students benefit from the consistency of staying in the same environment as their elementary years, deferring the need to navigate the transition of moving schools until their brains have moved through the most dramatic period of change. (Did you know that the degree of brain development that occurs during early adolescence is second only to that of the first year of life?!)
