Choose Drachman's Montessori Middle School Experience!

We have started a series of articles sharing some of the things that set Drachman's Montessori Middle School program apart from other middle school programs. In the first piece, we explained why:

Integrated curriculum themes and staying with the same teacher throughout the day lead to deeper learning.

This time, we'll tell you more about how:

Cooperative and project-based learning, integral in Montessori middle school, leads to better learning outcomes for students.

The middle school program is built around collaborative learning. Students work in groups every week to learn more about different subtopics within an overall topic and then together teach the class about their topic in a variety of ways. For example, the teachers present an overview lesson about the history of genetics, the DNA model, and Punnett squares. Then students work in small groups to research topics such as the work of Gregor Mendel, probability and heredity, the cell and inheritance, DNA coding, and mutations and cancer; they then share what they have learned through a variety of styles including PowerPoints, posters, and skits.

Other work is as hands-on and discovery-based as possible. For example, when learning about the periodic table of the elements, students get a set of cards that have a variety of characteristics but one card is missing, and based on the patterns in the characteristics, they have to describe the missing card. (This simulates how scientists were able to predict the existence of elements that had not yet been discovered.)

Research is clear that when students are actively engaged in learning, as opposed to being passive recipients of information, they learn more deeply and retain that learning longer; additionally, to teach material to others, students must build a greater understanding. The collaborative learning and hands-on or project-based work that are fundamental to Drachman's Montessori middle school program increase student engagement and improve student learning outcomes.

Reminder: Tax Credit for Drachman

Please consider giving Drachman a tax credit donation this school year. We use the funds to support field trip costs, our music programs, and student athletes. Married couples filing jointly can donate up to \$400 and individuals can contribute \$200. Donations in lower amounts such as \$5, \$10, and \$25 can also be made. Again, anyone who works in Arizona pays taxes to the state; a tax credit donation to Drachman lets you control where your tax dollars go. The money comes back to you with your tax returns in 2023. The deadline to donate for this fiscal year is December 31st, and you can donate online or in person at Drachman.
